Bury Lawn School was located in Union Street, Newport Pagnell. The school was housed in a beautiful, old house with two classrooms in the grounds. The school was solely a Junior School, with boarders residing during term time.

Everything to do with the school was traditional, from the subjects taught to the food. The uniform for girls at the school consisted of blue summer dresses, a blazer and a panama hat in the summer, and a navy tunic, white blouse, blue and yellow striped tie, navy gabardine coat and a velour hat in the winter.

All of the food served at Newport Pagnell was traditional home cooked food.
